## **Dr. Tahei Tahara**

**Tahei Tahara** graduated from the department of chemistry, the faculty of science, the University of Tokyo, in 1984, and obtained his PhD degree in 1989 from the same university. He became research associate of the University of Tokyo in 1989, and then moved to newly founded Kanagawa Academy of Science and Technology (KAST) as research associate in 1990. In 1995, he joined Institute for Molecular Science (IMS) as associate professor and started his own research group. He moved to RIKEN as Chief Scientist in 2001 and has been the Director of Molecular Spectroscopy Laboratory since then. He is also now Visiting Professor of Saitama University and Tokyo Institute of Technology, and Distinguished Visiting Professor of Indian Institute of Technology at Bombay. His research interests are ultrafast spectroscopy, nonlinear spectroscopy and single molecule spectroscopy of complex molecular systems. He received Award of Research Foundation for Opto-Science and Technology (1995), Morino Science Award (2000), TRVS Young Researcher Award (2001), IBM Japan Science Prize (2004), the JSPS Prize (2006), CSJ Award for Creative Work (2012), the Commendation for Science and Technology by MEXT(Prize for Science and Technology) (2017), and the Spectroscopic Society of Japan Award (2017).
